E-mail: Nalani Tarrant, Quality Collaboratives Project Manager ntarrant@acep.org Dr. David Gaieski from the Thomas Jefferson University Hospital led the implementation of a successful sepsis QI initiative at the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania which focused on sepsis quality improvement and early identification and treatment of patients with sepsis and septic shock.

What was the challenge?

While the sickest sepsis patients are immediately moved to a room for care to begin (the hypotensive or hypoxic patient, or those with changes in mental status) less obviously sick patients often wait in the waiting room, a hallway or even in a treatment space for extended periods without care being initiated.

What were the goals?

The goal was to use the vital signs recorded in the EMR along with chief complaints captured at triage and consistent with infection to identify at risk patients.

What was achieved?

We were able to generate the necessary programming changes in the EHR to order the lactate test reliably. The generation of the lactate order also identified patients as needing a bed more urgently, and nurses moved these patients to treatment spaces sooner. With further training and education, we were able to speed up the time to lactate draw and reach our goal of lactate draw in < 10 minutes from order.

What was learned?

We demonstrated that 94% of ESI 2 and 3 patients with a lactate value > 3mmol/L were admitted to the hospital and 43% of them to ICU, thus demonstrating that a cohort of patients initially assigned to wait in the waiting room could be identified as having a very high likelihood of admission and a significant risk for admission to the ICU based on addition of a serum lactate draw at ED triage.

If you were going to do this project over again what would you do differently?

We intend to modify the above process by using qSOFA along with SIRS, a modification of the chief complaints, and then utilizing fingerstick lactates drawn into a pediatric capillary tube, sent to the lab, and analyzed with a turn-around-time of < 15 minutes. We expect that obtaining the lactate sample through a fingerstick approach will improve compliance with lactate draw and speed up time to starting care.


